Rookie Driver (Point Score Only)

A Rookie Driver is both a new driver to the sport and drivers returning to the SRV Point Score Series following a period of 2 years or more where they have not been competing, or a driver that has been re classified a rookie at the discretion of the SRV Board. New Drivers must complete a minimum of 3 point Scores or 10 races before applying to the board to have the rookie status upgraded. The recording form attached to this booklet is to be completed at each point score and handed into the Chief Judge at control who will sign off, this should then be lodged with your Race Day report.

Once enough races are competed in then an application in writing is to be made to SRV for removal from Rookie status. The SRV Board must be satisfied with the driver's performance or more races may be required prior to approval. Returning drivers and drivers reclassified a rookie will be monitored and removed at the discretion of the SRV Committee. Any driver moving up to a forced induction engine will go back on Rookies while driving that boat. A minimum of 3 point Scores or 10 races before applying to the board to have rookie status upgraded. Whilst racing a 25mm red stripe is to be worn along bottom of number board. Rookies are to start on outside of field. A separate briefing for Rookie Drivers will be held after the main briefing. If a Rookie driver does not indicate on entry that they are a Rookie driver entry may be refused.

Novice Classes Fi Racing Victoria

All Novice competitors have to complete a Novice Application form, which lists their experience. This form needs to be completed and sent to SRV for ratification <u>before</u> entering a novice class. Refer to SRA Rule book. The form is available on SRV website.

SRV Point Score Boat Numbers

You must contact Lou Mudgway on 0414 967 290 to issue an SRV boat race number prior to your first event. Existing numbers will be retained and numbers will be issued to new applicants upon request.

Boats that have not raced in a point score series race for 2 seasons will forfeit their race number and need to apply for a new number.

<u>Fuel</u>

There is no refuelling in the water, car parking area or caravan parks. All refuelling is to take place in designated refuelling area.

Smoking

No Smoking in refuelling area, 6m of any boats in the water or 6m of judging area.

Boat equipment

All boat drivers and crew are to be fully aware of any marine safety requirements for on board safety equipment and must comply with any rules or regulations imposed on an event by such authority.

SRA worlds team training

A skier who has registered to compete for a place in the Australian team will be allowed at the race controller and chief judge's discretion to compete in additional races for training purposes only and not score points towards any SRV awards. The team must be briefed by Race Director and Chief Judge on how such racing will be conducted. Entry fee: \$43 per entry. Entries will run on the far outside in last grid, must pass to the outside. Must nominate classes you want to run in to the SRV board.

POINT SCORE SERIES – RACE DAY INFORMATION

Entries

Entries close Wednesday 10 days before the event. <u>ALL</u> entries after this date will be deemed late and incur late entry fee. Payment section on entry form must be completed or entry will not go into the draw.

Any entry with TBA boat or driver will be put on the outside of the grid. Entries from our online entry format only. No exception.

Cost per entry: \$43.00 (received prior to closing date)

Under 10 entries: No charge

Unlimited Two up Races \$75.00

Late entry cost: \$70.00

Late entries close: 3 races prior to event – for the first three races of each race day late entries close prior to start of the advertised briefing. Late entries for any class will only be accepted to fill the final grid within that class.

Marathon: \$43.00

All Substitutions \$5.00 (fee not applicable to broken down boats etc)

Age Divisions for Marathon Class are Open Men's, Open Women's, Under 16 Boys, and Under 16 Girls.

SRV Credits

SRV Credits are given for a non-start in an event on the following proviso:

- The skier is injured in an earlier event and cannot compete again that day
- The boat is broken and is unable to compete in that event
- Credits to be awarded by the entries coordinator before the 7-minute hooter for the event in question and will not be considered after.
- Credits will only be transferred if Transfer Form completed at time of race.
- SRV Credits can only be used for entry at the <u>next point score</u> event. If not used they are forfeited.

There are no financial refunds given either during or on completion of season.

Registration

Registration will be held prior to racing each day at the advertised times. During the advertised time boat sanction fee of \$40 is payable, \$10 per head SRA Competitor fee payable, names of helpers for the day provided.

Breath Testing

Breath testing to done by ALL competitors and officials. There will only be ONE Breath testing time slot, breath testing will finish at the end of the advertised Breath testing time slot - **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Drug testing at the discretion of SRV board and Race Director

Grids and Poles

Grids and poles will be run as per the program. No extra grids will be created for a class and no boats will be permitted to start in the grid of another class for the sake of a late entry unless permitted by the Chief Judge.

Helpers

Helpers are one of biggest problems at point score and we need more volunteers to spread the load.

All teams are required to nominated helpers on their entry form for each day of racing. These helpers are allocated positions and times to help which is available at registration and sign in. If the helper does not turn up for their duty the entry will lose any points won.

Take Note

On your entry form there will be 3 nominated classes for pack up, ANY teams entered in these 3 classes are required at time of entry to nominate a team member to assist at the end of racing, with many hands making light work of it. If the nominated team member from any entered team does not assist then no points will be awarded to that entry, this may seem harsh but we do need helpers other than those who have worked for you all weekend. No person can be nominated by more than one entry. (Please note if you are in more than 1 of these classes you will need to supply 1 person per class.)

Point Score Series Scoring System - 20, 16, 14 ----

The series is run on a point score basis with all boats, drivers, observer & skiers earning points for competing in each of their eligible divisions and classes.

First -	20 points	Sixth -	8 points		
Second -	16 points	Seventh -	6 points		
Third -	14 points	Eighth -	4 points		
Fourth -	12 points	All other finishers -	2 points		
Fifth -	10 points	Non finishers -	1 point		
Disqualified - No points					

Competitors must compete in a minimum 3 races in the Point Score series in a class to be eligible for end of season trophies.

The Victorian Titles also count as a point score making it a five race point score series.

Point Score Series Totals

- Competitor's best 4 results from the 5 race series are tallied to determine total points. In a 6 race series the best 5 results are used.
- Competitors must drop one race result. **Disqualified races cannot be dropped**.
- Competitors can drop a race they did not compete in.
- Competitors cannot drop a race held at an event at a time they were not a registered member of SRA.
- If one or more races are cancelled, then one race is still to be dropped.
- If there is a tied result there will be a count back of all events. If still tied the dropped race to be included. If still tied a joint result will be awarded.

<u>Grand Prix Series – 1000 point system used</u>

- All races entered will be used to determine total points.
- No race results will be dropped.

Usually held in late June, a venue and time will be advised on the website before the last point score event.

Any member failing a breath test or being Disqualified 2 or more times during the point score series will be ineligible for awards. (Not applicable to time penalty disqualifications)

Each Class will be awarded based on points tallied from our point score series

Special Awards for the Point Score Series

Boat of the year

Race number 1 will be awarded to the boat of the year. Score will be based on all point scores completed, same driver not required. Highest point scorer will be winner. No races are dropped. Count back if tied result.

Driver of the year

Score will be based on all point scores completed, same boat not required. Highest point scorer will be winner. No races are dropped. Count back if tied result.

Observer of the year

Score will be based on all point scores completed, same boat not required. Highest point scorer will be winner. No races are dropped. Count back if tied result.

Male Highest point scorer of the year

Score will be based on all point scores completed. Points will be totalled from the following 6 events only – Open, Social, Marathon, Own Age Division, one Engine Class & Two up. Same boat not required. Highest point scorer will be winner. No races are dropped. Count back if tied result.

Female Highest point scorer of the year

Score will be based on all point scores completed. Points will be totalled from the following 6 events only – Open, Social, Marathon, Own Age Division, one Engine Class & Two up. Same boat not required. Highest point scorer will be winner. No races are dropped. Count back if tied result.

Rookie Driver of the year

To be awarded to the Rookie driver starting in the season of racing who, in the opinion of the board of SRV, has displayed an understanding of SRA rules, competed in a fair manner, and assisted SRV where required in the running of events. Only new drivers to the sport are eligible for this award.

Chairman's Award for best team

Score will be based on all point scores completed. Highest point scoring boat and team with the same members competing in a class or classes will be the winner. No races are dropped. Count back if tied result.

Full Season awards

Scott Dominguez Male Skier of the year

Nominations for Male Skier of the year are to be sent to the Secretary of SRV in the month of May, giving details including results of all events competed in across all SRA sanction skiracing events. The board of SRV will consider all skiers and nominations and select who, in their belief, to be the best male skier for the season.

Female Skier of the year

Nominations for female Skier of the year are to be sent to the Secretary of SRV in the month of May, giving details including results of all events competed in across all SRA sanction ski-racing events.

The board of SRV will consider all skiers and nominations and select who, in their belief, to be the best female skier for the season.

Ashley French - Most improved junior skier male or female U19 years of age

Nominations for most improved junior skier of the year are to be sent to the Secretary of SRV in the month of May, giving details including results of all events competed in across all SRA sanction ski-racing events. Details of the type of improvement for the season must also to be included.

The board of SRV will consider all skiers and nominations and select who, in their belief, to be the most improved U19 skier for the season.

Club Person of the Year

Nominations for Club Person of the year are to be sent to the Secretary of SRV in the month of May, giving details as to why this person/s should be given the award. The board of SRV will consider all members and nominations and select who, in their belief, to be the best Club Person for the season.

Trans Tasman Challenge

This year's Tasman Challenge will be held in Australia at Lake Mulwala on 22nd and 23rd April 2017.

The 2016/17 Tasman team will be selected from the best 3 results from the first 4 point scores. Contact Lou Mudgway for Trans Tasman Challenge nomination form. The team will be announced at the earliest convenience after point score 4. Skiers may only ski in their own age division. Under 13 Lites are not eligible as this is a speed restricted class.

All competitors under 19 will be expected to help out with fundraising throughout the season. Failure to help out or any antisocial behaviour may mean exclusion from the team.
