Ski Racing Victoria Codes of Conduct for Tasman Challenge

Competitors (Drivers, Observers & Skiers)

- Compete in line with the relevant countries rule book (SRA or NZWSA).
- Never argue with an official. if you need clarification, have must contact your team manager to approach the official on your behalf.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your team our team's performance will benefit you, Tasman Challenge is about our team winning the cup.
- **Be a good sport** encourage your Victorian team members and assist them prior to their race and replicate for the New Zealand team members.
- Show respect to and acknowledge opponents and officials (e.g. shake hands before and after the race and say things like 'good luck', 'thanks for towing me' to the competitors.
- Cooperate with your team manager, team mates and opponents without them there would be no Tasman Challenge competition.
- Race fairly no verbal abuse of officials, sledging other teams (including vilification) or deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- **Do not expect or accept special favors** from the team manager or sub-committee or person involved in team or club management.
- Speak to an adult you trust or a SRV committee member if you have an issue, feel unsafe or are concerned about someone else.
- Do not engage in drinking of alcohol, taking illicit drugs or late-night activities during competition days, the presentation event or travel days relating to the event.

Sub-Committee and Event Officials

- All the above applies plus the additions below.
- Working with Children must be retained and valid while working with the Tasman Challenge.
- Keep up to date with the latest trends in officiating and the principles of growth and development of young people
- Compliment and encourage all participants— you are a role model and a source of a young person's confidence building.
- Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions.
- Condemn unsporting behavior and promote respect for all opponents.
- Place the safety and welfare of the participants above all else.
- Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards are they appropriate to the Tasman Challenge Event.

- Be familiar with relevant policies and procedures relating to a child safe environment.
- Promote a culturally appropriate environment.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Create pathways for young people to participate in the Tasman Challenge give them guidance, provide leadership opportunities and most importantly listen to them.
- Ensure that the types of programs, rules, equipment, length of races and training schedules are modified to suit the age, ability and maturity level of young players.
- Provide quality supervision and instruction for junior team members -ensure volunteers are adequately trained.
- Officials to highlight appropriate behavior and skill development.
- Ensure that everyone emphasizes fair racing not winning at all costs.
- Remember, you set an example your behavior and comments should be positive and supportive.
- Implement policy and practices (and lead by example) in relation to responsible use of alcohol and in relation to recreational and performance enhancing drugs.
- Adopt and implement relevant sport safety policies and practices.

Parents, Spectators and Support Crew

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment not yours.
- Encourage children to race according to the rules settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or not winning.
- Respect officials' decisions encourage children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for coaches, officials and administrators- remember they are usually volunteers.
- Applaud good performance and efforts from all individuals and the Victorian and New Zealand team.
- Congratulate all participants- regardless of the race outcome.

I agree to abide by this code of conduct;

• Condemn the use of violence, verbal abuse or vilification in any form – regardless of whether it is by spectators, team manager, officials or competitors.
